# $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ word from the Chairman Gopal Madhavan $\mathbf{VU2GMN}$

At the directors meeting in Canberra in 2010, a decision was taken that it would be advantageous for IARU to have a Memorandum of Understanding with Asia-Pacific Telecommunity (APT) so that a formal relationship was established enabling tabling of information papers at meetings where issues relating to amateur radio were being discussed. A draft MOU, based on APT guidelines, was drafted and later submitted to APT for consideration.

It was decided that the AWG-14 meeting of APT in Bangkok in March 2013, would be an opportunity to meet the Secretary General of APT and move the matter further. Accordingly an appointment was obtained and directors Shizuo Endo JE1MUI and Gopal MadhavanVU2GMN visited Bangkok and met with the Secretary General, Toshiyuki Yamada and his colleagues. A presentation was made demonstrating the advantages to both IARU and APT by the signing of such an MOU. This was well received and we are now awaiting further information from APT.

Gopal also took the opportunity of visiting the ITU Regional Headquarters in Bangkok to meet the Regional Director Mrs. Eun-Ju Kim and her colleagues.

Discussions took place on several specific areas where ITU and IARU could cooperate for furthering the amateur radio service, especially in the field of emergency services and promotion of amateur radio.

A request was also made for the allocation of some space for IARU to display the amateur radio service at ITU Telecom World 2013 in Bangkok later this year. It may be remembered that IARU Region 3 had a presence several times at ITU Telecom Asia when it was held in Region 3 and where the opportunity to interact with several hundred visitors, especially youngsters who could take up the hobby. This was appreciated by ITU and it is expected that IARU could have a presence at Telecom World.

The directors would like to call the attention of all societies to the minutes of the 15<sup>th</sup> Conference held in Vietnam in November 2012. This was circulated to all societies and is available on our webpage <a href="http://www.iaru-r3.org/">http://www.iaru-r3.org/</a>. It is important that the various decisions arrived at be acted upon expeditiously.

I look forward to support from everyone to achieve our objectives.

## Michael J. Owen VK3KI Award.

In memory of Michael Owen VK3KI, the IARU Administrative Council announced a new award. "The Michael J. Owen, VK3KI, Award" was established to recognize an individual or individuals that best exemplify the dedication and hard work of IARU volunteers.

In addition, the WIA proposed an annual award/trophy to be awarded to the highest individual operator score located in Region 3 in the IARU HF Contest.

The objective of the contest is to contact as many other amateurs, especially IARU member society HQ stations, around the world as possible using the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meter bands.

The contest is conducted on the second full weekend of July, beginning 1200 UTC Saturday and ending 1200 UTC Sunday. Both Single and Multi operator stations may operate the entire 24-hour period.

The Amateur Radio Festival, also known as JARL Hamfair will be held in Tokyo Big Sight, Ariake, Tokyo on Saturday 24 and Sunday 25th of August 2013.

Each year on 18 April, radio amateurs around the world celebrate World Amateur Radio Day. On that day in 1925 the International Amateur Radio Union was founded.

In 1913 there occurred the first recorded instance of amateur radio being used to provide communications in a natural disaster, during severe flooding in the Midwest of the United States.

Accordingly, the theme of the event for 2013 is "Amateur Radio: Entering Its Second Century of Disaster Communications."

Activities on the occasion of World Amateur Radio Day 2013 can be a great opportunity to spread the word about what the "hams" are doing in the field of disaster communications in the 21st Century.

# Ken Pulfer, VE3PU, SK

We are sad to record that J. Kenneth Pulfer, VE3PU, died Easter Sunday morning March 31, 2013 after a months-long illness. He was 80.

Ken served as chair of the working group for amateur and amateur satellite services within ITU-R Working Party 5A since Paul Rinaldo's retirement from that role in 2009 through the end of the WRC-12 cycle. His chairmanship capped a long professional and volunteer career in engineering and spectrum management, and was marked by the successful effort to obtain a secondary international MF allocation for the amateur service at 472-479 kHz. Including this term, Ken spent sixteen years in his retirement representing the Radio Amateurs of Canada and the IARU at various meetings in Geneva. His professionalism, insight, and positive attitude inspired and improved all who worked with him.
